

CRICKET ONTARIO

ANTI-DOPING POLICY

DEFINITIONS

1. These terms will have these meanings in this policy:
 - a. “CCES” – Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport.
 - b. “Individual”- All categories of membership defined in the Cricket Ontario Bylaws, as well as to all Individuals engaged in activities with Cricket Ontario, including, but not limited to, players/ athletes, coaches, officials, volunteers, directors, officers, team managers, team captains, medical and paramedical personnel, administrators and employees (including contract personnel).
 - c. “WADA” – World Anti-Doping Agency.

BACKGROUND AND POSITION STATEMENT

2. Cricket Ontario is unequivocally opposed, on ethical, medical and legal grounds to the practice of doping in sport and fully supports the position of International Olympic Committee, the Canadian Olympic Association, Sport Canada, the World Anti-Doping Agency, and the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport, against the use, possession and supply of banned substances and methods in basketball.
3. Cricket Ontario will continue to promote this position and will encourage its international and provincial/territorial partners to work together in support of a drug-free environment.

APPLICATION

4. This Policy applies to all Members as defined in the Definitions section.
5. Cricket Ontario will respect any penalty enacted pursuant to a breach of the Canadian Anti-Doping Program, whether imposed by WADA, CCES, or Cricket Ontario.

POLICY STATEMENT

6. Cricket Ontario recognizes the role of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) in setting global standards, coordinating anti-doping worldwide and implementing all portions of the World Anti-Doping Program.
7. The Canadian Anti-Doping Program is administered on behalf of WADA by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) and Cricket Ontario accepts and adopts the designated authority and policies of the CCES on all anti-doping matters.
8. For further clarity, Cricket Ontario has adopted and agrees to abide by the Canadian Anti-Doping Program as the anti-doping policy and regulations of Cricket Ontario, as administered by the CCES, and as it may be amended from time to time.

PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT OF RESULTS AND INFRACTIONS

9. Cricket Ontario will comply with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program guidelines with respect to public announcements of positive test results.

ANTI-DOPING EDUCATION PROGRAM

10. Cricket Ontario will provide regular information and news on the anti-doping program domestically and internationally, and will arrange for the presentation of an anti-doping educational program with support material from CCES to groups of athletes and coaches at camps and competitions whenever reasonably possible.

SANCTIONS

11. All Individuals and persons sanctioned by virtue of the Canadian Anti-Doping Program will be ineligible to participate in any role and in any competition or activity organized, convened, held or sanctioned by Cricket Ontario and the Provincial/Territorial Cricket Associations as per the penalties imposed.
12. Cricket Ontario may apply further sanctions or penalties in accordance with Cricket Ontario's Code of Conduct and Ethics, or its Discipline Policy.
